IOWA CITY, Iowa – October 5, 2017 – Chamber Singers of Iowa City is thrilled to announce the 2017-2018 season. CSIC will present *Passages* on November 12, 2017 at 7:00 pm, *Handel & Haydn* on February 25, 2018 at 3:00 pm., and *Waiting and Watching* on May 20, 2018 at 3:00 pm. CSIC will return to University of Iowa performance venues with concerts at Voxman Concert Hall in November and February. CSIC will travel to New York City to perform Haydn's *Missa Cellensis* in June 2018.

Since 2002, CSIC has been under the direction of Music Director, David Puderbaugh. CSIC performs traditional mass choral works, with full or chamber orchestra, and has expanded its repertoire to include a wide variety of choral music with emphasis on composers from the Baltic region. The ensemble represents volunteer singers from Johnson and nine surrounding counties.

CSIC has collaborated with the Joffrey Ballet, Orchestra Iowa, and the University of Iowa; the chorus has been the featured chorus in Bach's *Mass in B Minor*, Beethoven's 9th Symphony, Stravinsky's *Les Noces*, Verdi's *Requiem*, and Brahms's *Requiem* in recent performances. In 2009, the choir presented a concert of Estonian folk music in conjunction with the Iowa premiere of James Tusty's documentary "The Singing Revolution," exploring the significance of choral music in Estonia during the fall of the Soviet Union. In 2015, CSIC presented Handel's *Judas Maccabaeus* before the world's foremost Handel scholars and conductors as a finale for the the American Handel Society's biennial Handel Festival. Most recently in the 2016-2017 season, CSIC was the only non-University choir to join with the University of Iowa Music department to perform Gustav Mahler's Symphony No. 2 for the grand re-opening of Hancher Auditorium.

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
